# Budding Bards.

## Helen Keller

Helen Keller was born on June 27, 1880 in Tuscumbia, Alabama. She was an American author, lecturer and a political activist. When she was 19 months old, she got very ill. The illness left her both ill and blind. Anne Sullivan arrived at Keller's house on March 5, 1887, a day Keller would forever remember. She immediately began to teach Helen to communicate by spelling words into her hand, beginning with "d-o-l-l" for the doll that she had brought Keller as a present. Helen was viewed as isolated but was very in touch with the outside world. She was able to enjoy music by feeling the beat and she was able to have a strong connection with animals through touch. She was delayed at picking up language, but that did not stop her from having a voice. She went on to become a world-famous speaker and author. She is remembered as an advocate for people with disabilities, amid numerous other causes. The deaf community was widely impacted by her. She travelled to twenty five different countries giving motivational speeches about Deaf people's conditions. At age 22, Helen Keller published her autobiography,

The Story of My Life (1903), with help from Sullivan and Sullivan's husband, John Macy, It recounts the story of her life up to age 21 and was written during her time in college. She suffered a series of strokes in 1961 and spent the last years of her life at her home. She died in her sleep on June 1, 1968




## The Will To Win...


